Genevieve was also the founder of the Justice & Service Group. The Award is given to a Year 12 student who has been an active member of the Justice & Service group and who meets the Award criteria.

The Award criteria are:

- Sustained commitment to raising awareness of social justice issues
- Provision of leadership to the College community in working to alleviate social justice problems
- Representation of the College at interschool justice seminars/conferences and provision of effective feedback to the College community
- Provision of leadership through integrity and personal commitment to the goal of living out the Mercy ethos in daily life

The winner receives perpetual trophy design by Flynn's Silver that remains at the College, a beautiful Flynn Silver Pin and a certificate.
