Harrison is a keen and passionate sportsman with a love for both cricket and football and has excelled in both sports from a very young age.

Since 2017 Harrison has been selected every year as part of the AFL Central Victorian Academy. He has received multiple awards including most valuable player and the Lance Nicholls Best and Fairest award for Kyneton Under 16s and the Bendigo Junior Football League Best and Fairest in 2021.

Next season will see him move into the senior body of the Kyneton Football Club as part of the Under 18 side. He was also recently invited to trial for the Under 18 Bendigo Pioneers which is the first step into the AFL system. Harrison is a very versatile footballer who can play in many varied positions but spent much of this year playing key position and ruck.

A keen cricketer, Harrison has moved into the top Kyneton senior side for the 2020/2021 season. He has received multiple awards including "Under 15 play of Country Week" as part of the Gisborne and District Cricket Association. During the season Harrison was also selected to represent Melbourne University in the Under 16 Dowling Shield Side.

Harrison was then selected to be a part of the Cricket Victoria Under 17 Vic Country Emerging Players Program for the 2021/2022 season. He is also continuing with Kyneton in Under 17s and has once again been selected as part of the GDCA Under 17 Tier 1 Country week side and was recently named vice captain.
