Coburg co-captain Luke Cameron has produced a stunning matchwinning performance to highlight his side's second game of the JG Craig Shield.

Cameron top scored with 38 runs off 63 balls as his side were all out for 112 against Preston.

He then led the way with the ball, taking a hat-trick to claim figures of 3-11, alongside Aidan Lowe's 3-27, to guide Coburg across the line.

They were the final three balls of Preston's innings, who fell four runs short. It was a remarkable finish after Cameron had conceded three runs with his first ball of the over.

To add to the drama, Cameron has often been a wicketkeeper in the club's Fourth XI throughout the season.

Coburg coach Bill Tucknott, who has been involved in this competition for over 25 years, said he had "never seen anything like it".

"When we took the last catch, I almost belted my head on the roof in the coaches box," he said.

"Luke's a left-arm medium pacer but he's more of a batsman who bowls occasionally. This is probably the most dramatic and best win I've been involved in for a long time.

"The pressure was palpable and the boys managed to control themselves very well. It's a great lesson for so many of these young guys."

Coburg had been beaten in its first game of the competition, after Sunday's washout, and Tucknott was pleased to already see growth.

"Hopefully the kids take away something from this game," he said.

"It's nice to win the games but we want the kids to learn from the good and the bad."
